

Connection

- 1. Connect mains adapter and phone cable to respective wall sockets.
- **2.** To charge and power up your handset please pull the label from the bottom of the handset to connect the batteries.
- **3.** Charge the handset with the keypad facing outwards (for 24 hours the first time).
- **4.** Select language/date by following the instructions below.


Language

- **5.** Press to illuminate the display.
- 6. Press Menu.
- **7.** Scroll to **Setting** with the scroll button (\mathcal{P}/\mathcal{P}). Press **OK**.
- 8. Scroll to Handset Set. Press OK.
- **9.** Scroll to Language. Press **OK**.
- **10.** Scroll to required setting. Press **OK**.
- **11.** Hold down **_** to return to standby.

Date/Time

- **12.** Press **Menu**. Scroll to **Date/Time**. Press **OK**.
- 13. Scroll to Date/Time. Press OK.
- **14.** Set date (DD.MM.YY). Press **OK**.
- **15.** Enter time of day (HH MM). Press **OK**.
- **16.** Hold down **t** to return to standby.

To conserve battery power the display is very dark in standby mode, press ☆ to illuminate.

Base unit indicators

Illuminated on standby, flashes when telephone rings.

^{*} Only functions in certain countries.

Area of use

The handset is intended for indoor and outdoor use. It is shock resistant and is protected against water and dust (IP53), but it must not be immersed in fluid, treated violently or carelessly.

The base unit and extra charger (+1 only) are intended for indoor use only.

If the handset is damp it should be wiped dry before it is charged!

If the batteries need to be changed, ensure the battery door is properly closed with screws tightened to ensure water and dust resistance.

Battery

Because batteries only have a certain lifespan it is quite normal that call time and standby time will decrease somewhat compared to the specifications when the telephone is used regularly. Fully-charged batteries (10 hours charging) will last for approx. 120 hours standby time or approx. 10 hours call time. These operation times apply at normal room temperature. Full battery capacity will not be reached until the batteries have been charged 4-5 times. The base unit has an automatic charging mechanism that prevents the batteries from being overcharged or damaged due to prolonged charging.

The display is unlit during charging, to check battery level press 🌣 or lift the handset.

Please note!

The base unit should not be located close to other electrical equipment, in direct sunlight or near any other strong heat source! This is to minimize the risk of interference.

It is normal for the device to become warm during charging and is not dangerous.

Use only DORO original batteries. The guarantee does not cover any damage caused by incorrect batteries.

Coverage

The telephone's coverage will vary normally between 40 and 300 metres, depending on whether the radio waves carrying the conversation are blocked by obstacles in their path. Coverage can be improved by turning ones' head so that the handset is aligned with the base unit. Sound quality declines as the limit is reached until the call is finally interrupted.

Making a call

- **1.** Enter the required number.
- 2. Press , and the number will be dialled. Press _ to terminate the call.

Receiving a call

- 1. Wait for the handset to ring.
- **2.** Answer the call by pressing \(\strict{\cappa} \). Terminate the call with \(\sigma \).

Please note!

You can press **Menu** during a call to access certain functions. See Operator Services for more information. When the battery is low or when there is too great a distance to the base unit the telephone will be unable to connect to a line.

Volume control

Adjust the volume during a call with the scroll button.

Turning the handset Off/On

Press and hold the ___ button for a few seconds to turn the handset off or on.

Redialling

Press **Redial** and scroll through the 10 last dialled numbers. Press ...

•

In order to protect codes, e.g. for Internet banking, only numbers shorter than 18 digits are saved.

Temporary silent mode

When someone calls, you can press **Silent** to turn off the handset ring signal.

Key lock

Lock the keypad by pressing **until Press 19** is displayed.

Unlock keypad by pressing 119.

The keypad will be unlocked if the handset is placed in the base unit.

Speaker/Group listening

The handset can be placed on the table, leaving your hands free. Group listening means that you hold the handset to your head in the usual way, but the call will be heard through the speaker if you want other people in the room to listen.

- **1.** Once the call has been connected, press several times to switch between group listening, speaker mode and handset mode.
- 2. Press **t**o terminate call.

Please note!

Please remember that in handsfree speaker mode, it is only possible for one person at a time to talk.

Paging

The handset will ring when ≤ on the base unit is pressed. The signal will stop automatically after a while or if the button on the handset or the ≤ button on the base unit is pressed.

Phonebook

The phonebook can store 100 names and telephone numbers.

If you subscribe to a caller ID service the name in the phonebook will be shown for incoming calls.



It is possible to choose between various ring signals (VIP) for the numbers saved in the phonebook (only functions if you subscribe to a caller ID service).

You can select the desired VIP melody, see the Signals chapter.

However, the first signal can sound normal before the number is compared with the phonebook.

Letters

Each number key has been allocated certain letters. The phone book is arranged according to the order of the buttons, which is not the same for all languages.

- 0.....[Space]
- Change between upper/lower case

Store name/number in handset

- **1.** Press **□**. Press **Option**.
- 2. Scroll to Add Entry. Press OK.
- **3.** Press equivalent digit key one or more times for desired name.
- **4.** Scroll to **Number>**. Enter the telephone number, including the area code. Press **OK**.

You can insert a space in the telephone number by pressing and holding R.

Dialling from the phonebook

- **1.** Press **(**...)
- **2.** Scroll among the entries. It is also possible to make a quick search in the phonebook by pressing the equivalent numeral button for the first letter one or more times.
- **3.** Press , and the number will be dialled.

Changing telephone numbers/names

- 1. Press Q. Scroll to desired entry. Press Option.
- 2. Scroll to Edit Entry. Press OK.
- 3. Edit the name/number. Press OK.

Deleting entries

- 1. Press Q. Scroll to desired entry. Press Option.
- 2. Scroll to Delete Entry or Delete List. Press OK.
- **3.** Confirm by pressing **OK**.

Copying to/from SIM card

Development of SIM cards is very rapid, and therefore we cannot guarantee that all available cards on the market will function.

- **1.** Insert the SIM card into the base unit.
- **2.** Press \square . Press **Option**.
- **3.** Scroll to **Copy from/to SIM**. Press **OK**. Some SIM cards are protected by a PIN code.
- **4.** After a short time you can scroll to required entry. Press **Option**.
- 5. Scroll to Copy Entry or Copy All. Press OK.
- **6.** Downloading may take a few minutes. You can then remove the SIM card.

From SIM card

Check that the phonebook has been properly stored on the SIM card. Refer to the mobile phone user manual. Check that the correct country code has been saved, see Other Settings. A maximum of 14 letters and 20 digits can be copied per entry. The phonebook has a maximum size which cannot be exceeded. Entries are copied according to position, which may not be in alphabetical order.

To SIM card

You can also add an area code when copying entries to the SIM card.

Incoming numbers (caller ID)

The display shows you who is calling and the 50 most recent incoming numbers.

New SMS message/Caller ID is indicated by ⊠ in standby mode.

If the same number calls in more than once it will be saved as only one entry.



Please note!

This function requires a subscription from your service provider.

Retrieving and dialling incoming numbers

- 1. Press ⊠. Scroll to **Caller list**. The number of new calls is displayed. Press **OK**.
- 2. Select **New Calls** or **All Calls**. The number of received calls is displayed. Press **OK**.

Caller identification messages

---- Date/time not set.

Unavailable No information received, e.g. an international call.

Withheld Number cannot be shown. Possibly a call from a telephone exchange.

Deleting a number

- 1. Scroll to required entry according to description above.
- 2. Press Option and scroll to Delete or Delete List. Press OK.
- **3.** Confirm by pressing **OK**.

Storing a number in the phone book

- **1.** Scroll to required entry according to description above.
- 2. Press Option and scroll to Copy to Phone. Press OK.
- **3.** Enter names in the same way as for the phonebook.

SMS messages

This feature requires a current Caller Id subscription to be in place and only applies to text message users (SMS). Please remember individual SMS features are country dependent and will vary or be unavailable. Further details regarding the SMS text message service are available from you local network provider.



Maximum 160 signs per message. The memory can store up to 30 messages.

New SMS message/Caller ID is indicated by ⊠ in standby mode.

Australia only

Short Message Service (SMS) facilities have been automatically activated for most Telstra® telephone services across Australia. SMS services may not be available to, or between, other service providers networks. A description of the SMS service provided by Telstra® can be found at: http://www.telstra.com.au/talkingtext

There is no need to register your telephone with the Telstra® fixed line SMS service as your DORO telephone is supplied pre-configured. When you send your first text message the Telstra® network will automatically accept and deliver it (providing the destination offers a compatible service).

Settings for your Telstra® fixed line SMS service can be changed by calling 0198 339 999 and following the prompts.

UK only

- Program the correct SMS Center numbers as described on next page under the section Entering the telephone numbers in SMS centre/operator.

E.g. for BT:

Send: 14701709400 Receive: 080058752 Terminal No.: 9

- To register for the SMS text messaging service you can either send a text message to another telephone number, or text REGISTER to 00000.
- Should you wish to reset your SMS settings text RESET to 00000.
- You can also request a delivery report by entering * 0 # prior to any SMS message.
- An SMS message can also be sent to a telephone number that does not support this feature, and will be received as a voice message.
- Not all networks (ie mobile, cable) are compatible.

Please note!

The available functions/services vary depending on service provider. It may not be possible for all service providers to offer sending/receiving SMS messages on all types of units.

Some operators offer a service where you can send an SMS message to someone who does not have SMS equipment. The message will then be read by a computer voice.

Failed SMS messages are stored in the outbox.

Read new SMS/inbox

- **1.** Press ⊠. **SMS** is displayed. Press **OK**.
- **2.** Scroll to **Inbox**. The display shows the number of messages. Press **OK**.
- **3.** Scroll to selected entry. Press **Read**. Read your message.
- **4.** Press **Option**. Scroll to the required selection:
- Use (reply/forward)
- Delete
- Delete list
- Copy to Phoneb
- **5.** Press **OK** and follow the instructions in the display.

Write new SMS message

- 1. Press ⊠. SMS is displayed. Press OK.
- 2. Scroll to Write Message. Press OK.
- **3.** Select if your message is to be sent as SMS (most usual) or e mail*. Press **OK**.
- **4.** Press the equivalent number key for the desired text.
 - switch between upper/lower case A/a
 - o insert a space or special character
- **5.** Press **Option**. Scroll forward to send or store the message. Press **OK**.
- **6.** Enter the telephone number, or press **Option** to retrieve the telephone number from the telephone book.
- 7. Press Option.
- 8. Scroll to Send. Press OK.
- **9.** The display shows if the SMS has been sent successfully or not. If no error report is shown, the message has been sent successfully.
- *Requires special subscription. Remember to store special numbers in the service centre for E mail below.

Entering the telephone number in SMS centre/operator

Check that the correct number (without the terminal number) for your operator has been programmed. See details for UK/Australia on the previous page.

- **1.** Press ⊠. **SMS** is displayed. Press **OK**.
- 2. Scroll to Service centre. Press OK.
- **3.** Scroll to selected entry. Press **OK**.
- 4. Enter number. Press OK.

Remember to enter the correct terminal number as well, e.g. 0.

The available functions/services vary depending on service provider.

First ring signal

It may be a good idea to turn off the first ring signal if you are subscribing to an SMS service, in order to avoid any ring signal for incoming SMS.

- **1.** Press \boxtimes . **SMS** is displayed. Press **OK**.
- 2. Scroll to **Set First Ring**. Press **OK**.
- 3. Scroll to required setting. Press OK.

Network services

Most usual operator/extra services can be accessed via the menu or with the menu buttons during a call. Some functions are pre-programmed but is not certain that all functions will work on delivery as this will depend on the country of installation/operator. You can change the codes that are sent, see *Other Settings*.



Please note!

You may have to pay extra for some services, contact your service provider for more information. Some services will not work unless you have contacted your service provider to activate them.

Via the menu

- 1. Press Menu. Scroll to Net Services. Press OK.
- 2. Scroll to required service.
- **Withhold No** Withhold your number from recipient. The code for this service must be programmed manually, see *Other Settings*.
- **Call Divert** Incoming calls are always diverted to another number.
- **Call Waiting** Function off/on. This is a practical function for avoiding problems with temporary modem connections.
- **Wake up** Enter the time when you wish to receive your wake up alarm call. HH:MM.
- **3.** Press **OK**. Follow the instructions on the handset/display.
- **4.** Press **_** to terminate call.

During a call/On-line Menu

- 1. Connect an external call. Press **Menu**. Scroll to desired service (e.g.):
- Insert Pause May be required when dialling via PBX exchange.
- **Mute** to enable/disable the microphone.
- Make 2nd Call Dial a second number, e.g. to use in a conference or three-way call (=R).
- **Ringback** When the number is free you will hear a quick ring signal (=5).
- **Phonebook** To search the phonebook.
- **INT Call** Call another handset (+1...).
- **Tone** Temporary change to tone dialling.
- **Notebook** Store a number temporarily in the redial memory.
- **Reject Call** Reject an incoming call (=**R 0**).
- **End Current** Toggle between calls/End current call (=**R 1**).
- **Toggle** Toggle between calls/Answer incoming waiting call (=**R 2**).
- **Conference** Conference/Three-way call (=**R 3**).
- 2. Press OK.

Date/Time/Alarm

- 1. Press Menu. Scroll to Date/Time. Press OK.
- **2.** Scroll to required setting. Press **OK**.

Alarm Clock An activated alarm is indicated in standby mode by

. When the alarm goes off, an audio signal is heard for 60 seconds. Press any key on the handset to turn off. The volume is determined by the set ring signal level. If the symbol is not illuminated in standby mode, the reason may be that the clock is not set.

Date/Time Setting of date/time is described in *Connection*.

Other settings

- 1. Press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to **Setting**. Press **OK**.
- 3. Scroll to Handset. Press OK.
- **4.** Scroll to required function e.g. **Language**. Press **OK**.
- **5.** Scroll to required setting. Press **OK**.

Auto Answer The handset answers incoming calls when it is lifted from the base unit.

Vibrator The vibrator that is activated when the phone rings can be turned off/on.

Select Base Only used in systems with more than one base unit.

Language Language setting is explained in Connection.

Country code See separate description for programming country codes.

Baby Monitor Cordless baby monitor, see separate description.

Programming of speed dial numbers. To call one of these, press down Abbr number

the corresponding button 1-3.

Network It is possible to change the codes for operator services (CF=Call Forwarding).

You can change the pin code (0000 on delivery).

Register To register a new handset, see separate description. **Handset PIN**

Default Set Resetting the handset.

Cordless Baby Monitor

If you place the handset near the child (but out of reach), then you will receive a call if the sound from the child's room exceeds a set sensitivity level. You will then be able to hear the child for one minute.

- 1. Access **Baby Monitor** according to instructions on previous page.
- **2.** Scroll to desired setting as below with scroll button.

Activ. Activate function off/on.

Call to Select internal call (applies to +1...) or external call.

Level Setting of sensitivity level.

- **3.** Press **OK**. The display shows **Baby Monitor On**.
- **4.** Test the setup before use by shouting into the handset which is to be placed near the child, and have someone listen to the other unit.
- **5.** To avoid disturbing the child with incoming calls, you can turn off the ring signal by pressing and holding the **key**.
- **6.** Turn off the function by selecting **OFF**.

Important!

The Baby Monitor is a useful help, but it is obviously not a replacement for regular baby care.

Ensure the equipment is always out of the child's reach. Never place the handset in the cot.

We recommend activating the Call Waiting function on the receiving unit, e.g. a mobile phone, to avoid missing a call.



Country Code

To copy entries from the SIM card using "+", it is often necessary to enter certain information

Telephone numbers on the SIM card that have been stored with the international dialling code 00 followed by the country code will also be changed. Example of settings for UK:

Country code (domestic): 44 International prefix: 00

National prefix: 0

Register

Every new handset must be registered in order to use a base unit. Every base unit can manage up to 6 different handsets.

See Expanded Systems for more information.

- 1. Access **Register** according to instructions on previous page.
- **2.** Scroll to required base unit ($\sqrt{=}$ previous reg.). Press **OK**.
- **3.** Enter the base unit PIN code (0000 on delivery). Press **OK**.
- **4.** Press down the **≤** search button on the base unit until the indicator flashes.
- **5.** After a few seconds (max 60) any unused handset number will be displayed. Select one of these by pressing the corresponding key.

Signals and display

- 1. Press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to Ringer Set or Display. Press OK.
- **3.** Scroll to desired function, e.g. **Contrast**. Press **OK**.
- **4.** Scroll to required setting. Press **OK**.

These settings are usually not changed. System PIN is 0000 on delivery.

- 1. Press Menu. Scroll to Setting. Press OK.
- 2. Scroll to Base Set. Press OK.
- 3. Scroll to Dial Set. Press OK.
- **4.** Scroll to desired function e.g. **Access Code**. Press **OK**.
- **5.** Scroll to required setting. Press **OK**.

Access Code Enter the digit that obtains an external line and the telephone will

insert a pause automatically when a number starts with that digit.

Recall Time Only for adaptation to international company switchboards.

The UK setting is 98 ms. (600 ms in New Zealand).

Emergency No Emergency numbers are excluded from call blocking functions.

Dialling Mode The dial mode setting for UK must be Tone (Europe only).



Call barring

The telephone can block certain types of outgoing calls.

System PIN is 0000 on delivery.

- 1. Access **Call Barring** according to description on previous page.
- 2. Scroll to selected handset. Press OK.
- 3. Scroll to Barring Mode. Press OK.
- **4.** Scroll to required setting. Press **OK**.

INT call Only allows internal calls. Blocks all outgoing calls.

Barred no. Blocks the numbers you select, see below.

Setting barred numbers

Enter the sequence of digits for the type of call to be barred. Example: select 00 to block international calls. Three different bars of up to eight digits each may be used.

- 1. Access **Call Barring** according to description on previous page.
- 2. Scroll to selected handset. Press OK.
- 3. Scroll to Barring Number. Press OK.
- **4.** Scroll to selected entry. Press **OK**.
- **5.** Enter required digits (max 8). Press **OK**.
- **6.** Activate the **Barred no.** setting according to description on top of page.

Net. Provider

To choose a certain service provider, one would usually dial a prefix code before the actual phone number.

This function will automatically select the telephone network provider, e.g.:

Provider X (prefix 9301) for dialling international calls. Set up the LCR so that all phone numbers starting with 00 will be changed to 930100. System PIN is 0000 on delivery.

- 1. Access Net. Provider according to description on previous page.
- 2. Scroll to the required preselection. Press **OK**.
- **3.** Enter sequence to be sensed/exchanged (up to 5 digits, e.g. 00).
- **4.** Scroll to **Number>**. Enter sequence to be added (up to 10 digits, e.g. 930100).
- **5.** Scroll to required setting **Off**/ **On**. Press **OK**.

Please note!

To place your call with a certain network provider, you must be a registered subscriber.

The display always shows the entered number (not the number actually being dialled).

You can have up to four Net Provider options simultaneously.

If the number sensing option is not selected, the digits will be added to every call.

Expanded system (+1)

All handsets included in the package are registered to the base unit already. The handset number used for internal calls is shown in the display on standby.

The base unit should be positioned centrally so that the coverage area is roughly equal for all handsets.

You can register up to 6 handsets to one base unit.

This model is GAP (Generic Access Profile) compatible, which means that the handset and the base unit can both be used with most other GAP compatible units irrespective of manufacturer. However the GAP protocol cannot guarantee that all functions may be accessed.

INT calls

- 1. Press Menu.
- 2. Scroll to INT Call. Press OK.
- 3. Press All or enter the handset number 1-6 for the handset you wish to call.

A tone will be heard if an external call comes in while an internal call is in progress. Answer the external call by pressing **Accept**.

Conference/Transferring calls between handsets

- 1. While an external call is connected on line.
- **2.** Initiate an internal call as described above.
- **3.** Press **_** to transfer the call or press **Conf** for conference.

Specific absorption rate (SAR)

This device meets approved international safety requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Troubleshooting

Check that the telephone cord is undamaged and properly plugged in. Disconnect any additional equipment that may be connected, e.g. extension cords and other phones. If the problem is resolved, the fault is with the other equipment.

Test the equipment on a known working line (e.g. at a neighbour's). If the product works then the fault is with your telephone line. Please inform your local telephone company.

No number shown when ringing

- This function requires a subscription from your service provider.
- A switchboard cannot usually pass on incoming numbers.

Warning signal while talking/Cannot connect

- The batteries may be running low (recharge the hand unit).
- The hand unit may be (nearly) out of range. Move closer to a base unit.

Telephone does not work

- Check that the adapter and telephone cord are connected to the base unit and to their respective wall sockets.
- Check that you have selected Tone Dial, see System Settings/Dial.
- Check the charge status of the handset batteries.

The telephone continues to ring

- The telephone's ring signals do not follow the line signal, which means that the signal may continue for up to 10 seconds after answering a call.

SMS does not work

- In order for this feature to function, you must subscribe to the SMS service from your network provider.
- Check that the correct telephone number is stored for each service.

If the telephone still does not work, contact the place of purchase. Don't forget the receipt or copy of the invoice.
