






What's on the display?

To access the main menu, press the left soft key ___; the menu option will be displayed.

You can access the useful phone features that are organised in the different menus with the navigation keys on your iDECTX3i.

The navigation keys allow you tonavigate in a specific direction by pressing on the corresponding keys.

To navigate within the menu options in the iDECT X3i, simply press UP/▲ or DOWN/▼ key until you reach your selected option; then press the left soft key to confirm the selected option.



Read First Before Use

Choosing a site for the baseunit and charger pod

The base unit and charger pod(s) should be placed on a level surface, in a position where:

- the mains adapter plug will reach an easily accessible 230-VAC switched mains supply socket - never try to lengthen the mains power cable.
- the base unit's telephone line cable will reach your telephone line socket or extension socket (the charger pod does not have a telephone line connection).
- it is notclose to anothertelephone this can cause radio interference.
- it is not close to a sink, bath or shower, or anywhere else where it might get wet.

NOTE: if the base comes into contact with liquids, disconnect it promptly and use a soft cloth to dry it; if you believe that the liquid has seeped into the unit, do not reconnect the base station. Contact the IDECT Helpline. Follow the same procedure for your handset and remove the internal batteries.

- it is not close to other electrical equipment fridges, washing machines, microwave ovens, fluorescent lights, televisions etc.
- it is away from hot, humid conditions and strong sunlight.

Radio signals between handset and base unit

Signal range between the handset and the base station is in accordance with the approved standard for DECT phones:

- Maximum range: 300 metres outdoors.
- Maximum range: 50 metres indoor.

The signal range could become lower during normal use. Any large metal object, like a refrigerator, a mirror, a filing cabinet, metallic doors or reinforced concrete, between the handset and base unit may block the radio signal. The signal strength may also be reduced by other solid structures, like walls, or by other radio or electrical interference.

For stronger radio signal, it is recommended that your telephone is at the highest possible position. If there is no radio signal reception, Base 1 message and the signal level ψ icon will flash on the display.

Interference

If the sound quality gets worse as you move around while on a call, this is probably caused by interference between the handset and the base unit, perhaps because you are too near to another phone or other electrical equipment.

Move to a different position to clear the interference. If you do not move, it might cause a short break or your call may be cut off.

"Out of range" warning

If you hear a warning tone during a call, and the sound in the earpiece becomes faint or distorted, you may be going out of range of the base unit.

Move nearer to the base unit within 20 seconds, until the warning tone stops. Otherwise, your call may be cut off.

Mains power connection

IMPORTANT - The iDECT X3i base unit must be used with the mains adapter supplied with the unit. Using any other adapter will result in non-compliance with EN60950, and will invalidate any approval given to this apparatus.

Battery safety

ONLY use the rechargeable batteries supplied with the handset. **DO NOT** use non-rechargeable batteries - they may burst and cause damage to your telephone.

If you have a Broadband line

If you connect your telephone to a line with a broadband connection, you will need to insert a micro-filter between the telephone and the telephone line; otherwise you may get interference


line; otherwise you may get interference between the telephone and the broadband, which could cause problems.

In a home with broadband, every telephone must have a micro-filter connected, not just the one at the telephone point that your modem is connected to. If you need more broadband micro-filters, contact your broadband supplier.

Installation and Set-up


- 1 Choose a suitable site for the base unit (see page 3).
- 2 Connect the mains power lead and the telephone line cord into the base unit.

Plug one end of the telephone line cord into the socket on the back of the base. Use the telephone line cord supplied with your iDECT X3i - other line cords may not work with this phone.



3 Plug the mains adaptor into your wall socket. If you have one or more charger pods, plug in the mains adaptors accordingly.


Make sure that the 230VAC, 50hz mains socket is switched OFF when you plug the mains adapter into the socket. Switch it ON only when you have the adaptor plugged in safely.



4 Fit the rechargeable batteries in each handset.

- A. Push down on the top of the battery compartment cover (located on the back of the handset) and slide the cover off as shown.
- B. Lift the battery pack and connect its plug to the socket inside the compartment, as shown.





5 Charge the batteries for 24 hours before 1st time use.

Before you use the handset for the first time, it is important that you charge the batteries fully. You will hear a 'beep' when the handset is correctly positioned on the charging cradle.

Leave the handset on the base unit or charger pod for 24 hours. To keep the batteries charged, whenever you don't need to use the handset (such as overnight, or when you go out), leave it on the base unit or charger pod.



Battery life:

Standby time: 100 hours Talk time: 10 hours

Note:

Battery life depends on device usage. Therefore, it is recommended that you read the following notes of caution.

When the batteries are low, the handset will display the corresponding icon
 Place the handset back on the base station: the battery icon
 will start flashing.

- Use only original batteries and charge them only on the original base station or charger pod(s).
- Insert the batteries properly as previously described.
- Do not dispose of the batteries in fire: this may cause an explosion.
- Remove the batteries from its compartment if the phone is not used for a long period of time.

6 Connect the base unit to the telephone line.

Switch OFF power at the mains socket and insert the telephone line plug into the socket then switch mains power back ON.

- ** You can switch the handset offand save battery.
- ** When the handset is in "off" mode, the unit can not be used for emergency calls.

Note: To answer a call when the handset is switched off, you need to switch it back on. It may take a few moments for the handset to re-establish a radio link with the base unit.

- Press the button, then press the UP/▲ or DOWN/▼ button to go through the colour list (there are 3 colours to choose from).
- Press the button to select the colour e.g. Yellow, the display shows Saved.
- 7 Press the HANG UP/C button to return to idle mode.

Note: The 3 colours are: Blue, Green, Yellow.

Making and answering calls / Earpiece volume adjustment during calls

Make a call

- 1 Press the PHONE button or the SPEAKERPHONE button to connect to the line.
- 2 Then dial the required telephone number.
- Press UP/▲ or DOWN/▼ button to adjust the volume of the earpiece during your conversation (5 volume levels).
- 4 Press the HANG UP/C button to end the call.

Note: You can also make a call by using the Pre-dial function: Dial the required telephone numberfirst (if you enter a wrong number use the button to delete and re-enter) then press the **PHONE** button to make the call.

Answer a call

- Press the **PHONE** button or Speakerphone buttonn to answer a call when the telephone rings.
- Press UP/▲ or DOWN/▼ button to adjust the volume of the earpiece during your conversation (5 volume levels).
- 3 Press the HANG UP/C button to end the call.

Note: If Auto answer is set then lifting the handset off the base or charger will answer the call and no buttons need to be pressed.

Last number redial function

- Press UP/▲ to view dialled calls.

 → The display shows Dialled calls.
- Use the UP/ ▲ or DOWN/ ▼ button to stroll through the list of dialled numbers.
- 3 Once selected press the PHONE button to dial.
- 4 Press the HANG UP/C button to end the call.

How to entercharacters?

To use the characters you press on the button where you see the character, e.g. if youwant to insert the letter 'A', you press '2' \2 - / .if you want to insert the letter 'B', you press twice and for 'C', three times etc.

If you want to insert 'AA', then you will have to wait for the first 'A' to stop flashing then insert the second 'A'. Press '0' of for space.

Use the UP/ ▲ or DOWN/ ▼ to select Add Entry. Press the button. → The display shows **Add Entry >Name:**. Use the digit keys to enter the name, e.g. Jane. Press the button to confirm. → The display shows Add Entry >Number:. Use the digit keys to enter the number, e.g. 123456789. Using a multi-handset system

Make intercom calls

- 1 Press the INTERCOM button on any handset (i.e. handset 1).

 → The display shows Internal Call.
- 2 Use the digit buttons to enterthe handset number you want to call. (e.g. Handset 2)

Handset 2 will ring.

- Press the handset 2's PHONE button to answerintercom
- 4 Press the HANG UP/C button to go back to idle mode.

Transfer calls

When one handset is on an external call and you want to transfer call to another handset.

- 1 Press the INTERCOM ▶■■ button on your handset. → The display shows Internal Call.
- 2 Use the digit buttons to enter the handset number you want to transfer the call to and the external caller will be automatically put on hold. (e.g. Handset 2)
- 3 Handset 2 will ring.
- Press PHONE on ringing handset and the two internal handsets will be connected and can hold a private conversation, while the external call remains on hold.
- You can press the handset 1's HANG UP/C button to transfer call to handset 2. Which ever of the handsets hangs up first will automatically connect the other handset to the external call.

Set up a three-way conference

You can have a three-way conference when you are on a call with an external line.

- 1 Press the INTERCOM Internal Call.

 → The display shows Internal Call.
- Use the digit buttons to enter the handset number you want to enter the conference and the external caller will be automatically put on hold. (e.g. Handset 2)

Handset 2 will ring.

- When the handset 2 answers your intercom call, press and hold the handset 1's **HASH** button to enter conference call.
- Any party can exit the conference by pressing the HANG UP/C button, leaving the other two parties connected.

Paging handset

The paging function is useful when you need to locate your handset(s).

At the bottom of the base set you will find the HANDSET

LOCATOR 🕏 button.

- Press the **HANDSET LOCATOR** button and your handset(s) will ring.
- 2 Press or button of the handset to stop it ringing.

Handset registration

- * When you purchase a iDECTX3i multi-handset system, all handsets are already registered: you do not need to register any of the handsets.
- * Handset registration is only necessary when you buy an extra-handset by itself.

Registering a handset

On the base unit, press and hold the **Handset Locator** (\$\overline{\pi}\$) button at the bottom of base set until you hear registration tone (repeated 'beeps'). On the handset unit, press the menu button. 2 → The display shows SMS. Use the UP/ ▲ or DOWN/ ▼ button to select Registration. Press the __ button. Use the UP/▲ or DOWN/▼ button to stroll through the list of base. (If any of the list with Star * at right side, the handset is already registered to that base unit.) When you reach the base you want to register, press the button to select. (e.g. Base 1) → The display shows System PIN. Enter the PIN using the digit buttons. Outgoing messages (OGMs)

An OGM is the greeting the caller hears when he/she gets through to the answering machine. The X3i has two OGMs and you can record your own message.

OGMs that are already on the machine:

OGM1- this invites callers to leave a message: 'Sorry, we cannot answer your call now. Please leave your message after the beep.'

OGM2 - this simply asks callers to try later and does not give them the opportunity to leave a message: **'Please call later.'**

If you wish to create your own OGM, you can record between 4 seconds to 2 minute. If you speak for less than 4 seconds, your message will not be recorded.

To record OGM1

- Press and hold the **ON/OFF/STOP** button until the machine says '**ANSWERING MACHINE ON**' and the base unit's display should change from - to 00.
- Press and hold the **OGM/REWIND** button until you hear a beep and the segments on the base unit's display will start to rotate.
- Record your personal **OGM**, speaking clearly from a distance of about 15cm (6 inches) from the base unit's microphone.
- When you have finished speaking press the **ON/OFF/STOP** button to stop the recording and the machine will play back your recorded **OGM**. If you want to change it, simply record it again by following steps 1 4.

To record OGM2

- If the machine is not on press and hold the **ON/OFF/STOP** button until the machine says **'ANSWERING MACHINE ON**.
 The base unit display should shows 00.
- Press the ON/OFF/STOP button and the base unit display should shows 02 then A0.

When the machine is switched off, it will answer after 15 rings and play **OGM2**. You can switch it on using remote operation.

Note: When **OGM2** is selected the machine will not record messages therefore if you want callers to leave messages make sure **OGM1** is selected.

To record a memo

To record a memo

You can record a memo (for 4 seconds to 2 minutes) directly into the machine. It will be played back together with any messages from callers.

- Record your memo, speaking clearly from a distance of about 15cm (6 inches) from the base unit's microphone.

Volume control To adjust the volume of the loudspeaker during playback: Press the **VOLUME** - or + ______ buttons under the base unit display (there are 10 volume levels including L0 for 'off').

To intercept a call

If you hear the answering machine recording a message and you want to intercept the call and speak to the caller, you can:

Press the PHONE button on the handset.
OR

Press the SPEAKERPHONE button on the handset.
OR

Lift the handset of any other phone connected to the same line.

Note: When you intercept a call, the machine will stop recording the caller's message. If you intercept a call within 3 seconds of its start, the answering machine may not stop the machine recording.

To delete the current messages

To delete all old messages

1 Press and hold the **DELETE** button until the machine says 'All messages deleted'.

Note: Remember to delete messages after you have listened to them otherwise the machine's memory may become full and will not be able to record any new messages. When the memory is full the base unit's display will show FU. (When the memory is full, it will answer after 15 rings.)

The machine will not delete any messages you have not yet listened to. The machine's memory has room for 12 minutes of recording time, or up to 55 individual messages.

If you no longer want callers to hear the OGMs you have recorded, you can delete them and revert to the original OGMs.

- 1 If necessary, press the **ON/OFF/STOP** button to switch to the OGM you want to delete.
- 2 Press the OGM/REWIND button to play the message
- While the message is playing, press the **DELETE** button.

Remote operation

You need to enter a three-digit pass number if you want to dial home to receive your messages. The original pass-number is **321**. Otherwise you are able to set your own three-digit pass number (please see page 39).

Move the handset closer to the base unit.

If the fault persists...

Disconnect all other instruments connected to the same line as the iDECT X3i and try to make a call.

Disconnect the base unit from the telephone line and plug a differenthone into the master telephone socket. Try making a call. If this works, the line is OK.

If the call does not work, and you are using a **two-way socket adapter**, remove it and plug a telephone directly into the socket. If the call now works, the adapter may be faulty.

If you cannot make a call, the fault may be on the **exchange line**. Contact the service provider (the BT engineers on 151 for UK only, or your cable company).

If you still cannot identify the cause of the problem, contact the iDECT Helpline on 0845 345 9677 (UK only).
